

36th Synod in Session

As we start to seriously prepare for our face-to-face Synod in May of 2022, we are starting to imagine what that might look like if significant COVID restrictions are still in place. The latest lockdown in Victoria is a timely reminder that while Australia may have been successful so far in managing community transmission, the impacts of COVID on the community is ongoing and disastrous. As part of our commitment to care for all people in our community, we have to act in ways that will limit community transmission and care for those attending a face-to-face gathering.

The Synod Standing Committee have asked that we be prepared for restrictions to our meeting and so the Business Committee of the Synod have proposed that we prepare a **Plan B**, based on our current community restrictions. **Plan B** will entail a restricted number of representatives, COVID compliant planning, ticketed and allocated seating, a modified program and adapted catering approaches. The decision on whether to implement **Plan B** will be made in October 2021, with a final decision as to whether to postpone the face-to-face meeting to be made in March 2022.

Assembly news

Beyond Violence

The Uniting Church Assembly this week launched **Beyond Violence**, a new resource that aims to help congregations and communities begin a conversation about Domestic and Family Violence (DFV).

In a <u>video introduction</u>, Uniting Church Assembly President Dr Deidre Palmer and National Consultant Rev Charissa Suli speak of the Uniting Church's commitment to say no to all forms of violence and urge church members to help change the culture that allows DFV to occur.

The resource includes theological reflection, worship resources, key statistics, helpful information on how to pastorally care for those experiencing or fleeing DFV and key actions we can take to build a world "Beyond Violence".
