Moderator's Message – Disaster Relief Fund



Dear family in Christ,

We are thinking of all of you who face the challenges of bushfires in your communities this fire season. Our thoughts and prayers are with the affected families and communities during these challenging times, as well as with the dedicated congregations providing support to those in need.

The Queensland Synod seeks to offer practical help as we face these challenges together. If you or members of your congregation or community are in need, please apply for the Queensland Synod's <u>Disaster Relief fund</u>. These funds can be used by congregations and/or Presbyteries to assist with any additional/extraordinary expenses incurred in responding to their community's needs following the recent disasters. The application form is a short one to make the process as simple as possible. If you have any questions, please contact Vanessa.Griffiths@ucagld.com.au.

There are several other grants which **individuals** may be eligible for:

The Essential Services Safety and Reconnection Scheme (ESSRS) grant helps people who are uninsured or unable to claim insurance and who meet an income test by providing a contribution towards inspecting, repairing, and reconnecting essential services (i.e. electricity, gas, water, or sewerage) that were damaged by a disaster.

The Emergency Hardship Assistance (EHA) grant helps people affected by a disaster to get:

- Food, clothing, medical supplies, temporary accommodation
- They can apply for \$180 per person, up to \$900 for a family of 5 or more
- This grant isn't income or asset-tested

<u>The Essential Household Contents Grant (EHCG)</u> helps people who are uninsured or unable to claim insurance and who meet an income test by providing a contribution towards repairing or replacing essential household contents that have been damaged or lost in a disaster.

If you would like to lend a hand to support our Uniting Church local congregations as they help local communities, please consider a donation to the <u>Queensland Synod Disaster Relief Appeal</u>.

Lifeline has also set up a donations page to support funding of their crisis call lines.

The unpredictable nature of bushfires makes it essential for all Queenslanders to stay informed and prepared. Below are some steps to follow:

- Stay informed: Regularly check Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES) <u>current</u> <u>bushfire warnings and incidents</u>
- **Prepare a bushfire survival plan**: Make sure you and your family have a well-thought-out plan in place in case of evacuation or emergency.
- Create a survival kit: Put together an emergency kit with essential items like water, non-perishable food, first aid supplies, important documents, and clothing.

- Stay vigilant: Keep an eye on local news and weather reports and be ready to act if conditions change.
- Observe total fire bans and fire restrictions: Respect all fire bans and restrictions, as they are in place for your safety and the safety of the community

- StandBy support is free, and accessible 24 hours a day, seven days a week. We can:
 - Arrange face-to-face or telephone support.
 - Help you understand and respond to your needs.
 - Provide information and referrals to other local organisations.
 - Run tailored workshops to meet community needs.
- → We support anyone who has been bereaved or impacted by suicide, including:
 - Individuals, families and friends.
 - Witnesses.
 - First responders and service providers.
 - Schools, workplaces and community groups.

[Anyone who has been impacted by suicide can access the service, regardless of when the person died by suicide or whether you knew the person who passed away.]

- Pray for the staff wisdom and guidance as they interact with clients to work through the issues raised. For safety for the Cairns staff, as they travel to people and communities in Central and Northern QLD.
- Pray for Clients that they may know God's love, comfort and healing as they work through this often confusing time.

The discernment and lived experience of local Uniting Church communities is essential to helping us understand whether we are heading in the right direction. We encourage you to continue to support local communities to reflect on the **Directions** for local communities of faith and discipleship (found in Section 5 of the report). In addition we would also like to encourage you to engage the presbytery in responding to the **Options** (found in Section 6 of the report).

This email is to remind you that the deadline for responses is 30 November.

Now is the time to make sure that in the next two months there is adequate opportunity for your whole community to give concrete feedback about future directions for our Church.

The input we receive by 30 November will shape the proposals to go before the Assembly meeting in July 2024. As you prepare to make your response, please don't hesitate to reach out to our team. Find all the ways you can contact us here.

Vale Rev Gale Hall

Later, he assumed the vital position of being the Uniting Church member for the Religious Advisory Committee to the Services, a role he held for approximately 11 years. Additionally, Gale contributed his leadership as the General Secretary in the Northern Synod, although he spent the majority of his time serving in Queensland.

His beloved wife, Phyllis, also played a pivotal role in the church community, serving as the Secretary for Moreton Rivers Presbytery for several years. Together, they raised two children, leaving a lasting impact on their family and community.

From The Word for Today...

God is good - all the time!

'Oh, taste and see that the LORD is good; Blessed is the man who trusts in Him!' Psalm 34:8 NKJV

What you believe about God is crucial to the quality of your life, especially in difficult times. So, starting today, tell yourself, 'God is good – all the time,' and keep saying it until it gets down into your spirit.

What does it mean to be 'good'? It means living up to the best and highest one knows. And since God always knows what's best and highest, His goodness is beyond question. If God is good – genuinely, practically, consistently good – then your cup of well-being, security, peace, confidence, and joy should be overflowing!

A good God can't break His promise, abandon His children, or fail to love and provide for them. In every trial and circumstance, you can be sure He will treat you in the best possible way. When things seem to be falling apart, when you stumble confused in the dark, it's hard to see God's goodness or feel that things will get better. That's when you must draw on the faith God has deposited in you (see Romans 12:3), and by an act of your will, trust Him.

A troubled parishioner once asked his pastor, 'Does the world look like a wreck to you too?' He replied, 'Yes, like the wreck of a bursting seed! Without the 'wreck' stage when its world appears to be falling apart, the acorn could never give birth to an oak tree.'

So, embrace God's will in your time of testing because it's 'good, and acceptable, and perfect' (Romans 12:2 KJV). Ultimately, you will '... see that the LORD is good; Blessed is the man who trusts in Him!' (Psalm 34:8 NKJV)
