

Similarly, Moreton Rivers Presbytery's Easter Madness event exemplifies Alex Park's ability to facilitate deep spiritual experiences and meaningful connections: "Faith, friends, fun!" was one guest's wrap-up.

Events such as the Uniting Qld Synod in Session are held here, where (as you know!) members gather to engage in fellowship, worship, and reflection. Family Camp is a yearly testament to Alex Park's ability to create an inclusive environment for families to draw closer and create lasting memories.

As Danny emphasises, Alex Park's ministry extends beyond Christian circles, welcoming individuals of all backgrounds to connect with its Christian heritage and embrace the shared values of unity and inclusivity. The outdoor bush chapel serves as a poignant reminder of the spiritual foundation upon which Alex Park was built, offering visitors a sacred space for reflection and connection with nature.

In today's fast-paced world, characterised by digital distractions and societal divides, Alex Park remains a haven of serenity and community, creating respite from the pressures of modern life so people can reconnect with themselves, each other, and the divine.

Congregations are eligible to apply for \$5000 grants from this fund, with a 100% approval rate thus far.

From The Word for Today...

Pull down those strongholds

'The weapons of our warfare are ... mighty in God for pulling down strongholds.' 2 Corinthians 10:4 NKJV

When the Bible speaks of a stronghold, it's referring to an area in your life that's controlled by wrong thinking. And that stronghold will attract people who think the same way and feed off it. But there is good news. Not only will God reveal to you the strongholds in your life, He will also show you the experiences that caused them. Some of us worry obsessively about money because we grew up in hard times. As a result, we're inclined to depend more on ourselves than on God. When it comes to money, we hide it, hoard it, or withhold it. And because we're afraid to sow it, we miss the very harvest that would solve our problem. 'So, how can I deal with my stronghold?' you ask. Attack it with the Word of God.

You don't have to accept whatever comes into your mind; you have a choice! If a thought lines up with the Word of God, accept it – if it doesn't, reject it. When Satan comes against you, don't just sit there and say, 'I wish he would leave me alone. I don't feel like fighting today.' If you do, he will 'devour' you! (See 1 Peter 5:8.)

Paul describes your Bible as '... the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God;...' (Ephesians 6:17 NKJV). Did you get that? The Holy Spirit within you will wield the sword of Scripture for you – provided you have done *your* job, which is to get the Word of God inside you. Do you want to pull down the strongholds in your life? Reprogram your mind with the truths of God's Word.
